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Study Notes for T.C.M.P. Reading and Language

**Nouns**

- Plural Nouns (Nouns that are more than 1)
  - Most nouns add -s
  - Words that end in ch, sh, s, or x add -es
  - Words that end in y, change the y to an i then add -es
  - Some nouns change completely. Ex: man-men and woman-women
  - Some nouns don't change at all. Ex: fish, time, sheep
- Possessive Nouns (When something belongs to the noun)
  - If the noun is singular (one), add 's (Example: woman's)
  - If the noun is plural (two) AND ends in s, just add 's (Example: women's)
  - If the noun is plural (two) and doesn't end in s, add 's (Example: cars')
  - \*\*\*Sometimes you will have to figure out if the noun is plural or singular to make your choice\*\*\*

**Exercises**

- Match each who they are referring to.
- Ex: He walked out the door and tripped on his own feet. "Her is wrong. It should be his."
- Ex: You will enjoy the park because there are lots of things for them to do. "There is wrong. It should be you."

**Verbs**

- The verb must make sense and match the rest of the sentence.
- TIP: If there is a helping verb (had, have, has) choose the verb with the "to" on the end. Ex: "We **had** not **went** to the store."
- TIP: Read each sentence and think the ones that you know are incorrect. The best way to choose the correct verb is to use which one makes sense.

**Adjectives**

- Adjectives describe nouns.
- Add -er to compare two things. (Add more if the word is long!)
  - Example: She was taller than him.
  - Example: She was **more** beautiful than her friend.
- Add -est to compare more than two things. (Add more if the word is long!)
  - Example: She was the tallest.
  - Example: She was the **most** beautiful of all her friends.

**Adverbs**

- Adverbs describe verbs.
- More end in -ly.
  - Ex: He was really happy when the accident came at his.

**Double Negatives**

- You cannot have two negatives in a sentence. Negatives include: neither, never, not, nothing, or any connection with not.

**Uncountable**

- Two, Two 1/2
  - Two -2
  - Two- Too much or Also
